**STATE DEFENDANTS' MOTION TO DEEM THEIR EXHIBITS FILED IN
ONE OF THESE CONGRESSIONAL REDISTRICTING CASES AS FILED IN ALL THREE
AND MOTION FOR CLARIFICATION ON DELIVERIES**

Pursuant to this Court's Order today, *Singleton*, doc. 267, *Milligan*, doc. 401, and *Caster*, doc. 316, Secretary of State Wes Allen, Sen. Steve Livingston, and Rep. Chris Pringle respectfully move this Court to deem that any exhibits they file in one of these three cases is also filed in the other two, as set out below. Further, given the volume of exhibits at issue, the State Defendants' respectfully ask the Court to confirm delivery locations.

1. *Singleton*, *Milligan*, and *Caster* are all challenges to Alabama's 2023 Congressional map and are being tried together in Birmingham in February 2025.

2. In the Order Setting Pretrial Conference, the Court ordered that three file-stamped copies of the exhibits be delivered to the Chambers of Judge Marcus, Judge Manasco, and Judge Moorer, in, respectively, Miami, Birmingham, and Mobile. *Singleton*, doc. 259 at 2-3, *Milligan*, doc. 392 at 2-3, and *Caster*, doc. 307 at 2-3.

3. Upon joint motion of the parties, the deadline for delivery has been extended to this Friday, December 20, 2024. *Singleton*, doc. 265, *Milligan*, doc. 399, and *Caster*, doc. 314.

4. On December 6, 2024, the State Defendants filed an exhibit list of 370 exhibits in each of the three cases. *Singleton*, doc. 263, *Milligan*, doc. 396, and

Caster, doc. 311. The State Defendants' exhibit list is the same for each of the three cases.

5. While the State Defendants are withdrawing some exhibits, they expect to file and print approximately 335 exhibits. To file those exhibits in each of the three Congressional redistricting cases would require filing approximately one thousand documents.¹

6. Accordingly, in the interest of efficiency and judicial economy, the State Defendants respectfully move the Court to deem that any exhibit they file in one of these three Congressional redistricting cases as filed in the other two as well.

7. Further, given the bulk of their submissions and the presumed need for the Court's copies of the exhibits to be in Birmingham for the in-person trial, the State Defendants respectfully ask the Court to confirm that hard copies of all exhibits for Judge Marcus and Judge Moorer should be sent to Miami and Mobile, respectively.

8. Finally, the undersigned counsel for the Secretary of State apologizes to the Court and to all Plaintiffs' counsel for not realizing that the filing matter should be handled as a formal motion to the Court, rather than by communication with the

Courtroom Deputy, and for failing to include Plaintiffs' counsel in that communication.

9. Counsel for the *Singleton*, *Milligan*, and *Caster* Plaintiffs have confirmed that they do not oppose this motion.
