DEFENDANTS' CONSENT MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Under Rule 7 of this Court's Local Rules, Defendants respectfully move this Court (with Plaintiff's consent) for a two-week extension of time to respond to Plaintiff's complaint and summary-judgment motion. Per the parties' joint motion for a scheduling order, ECF No. 15, and the Court's prior order, Minute Order (Jan. 25, 2022), Defendants' received one previous extension of these deadlines, making their responses currently due February 25, 2022. But due to the press of undersigned counsels' other matters—including a preliminary-injunction motion, two summary-judgment motions, and an oral argument—Defendants need more time to prepare their responses and fully present these issues for the Court. Plaintiff consents to this motion, which would extend Defendants' response deadline to March 11, 2022. And it will not impact any other deadlines: Plaintiff's reply and response to Defendants' motion(s) will remain due on or before April 8, 2022, Defendants' replies will remain due on or before May 6, 2022, and the parties will provide hard copies of the briefing and joint appendix on or before May 20, 2022. A proposed order is attached.
