As drafted, the map that has been created for new Senate District 49 fails to properly represent the area and its communities of interest. As the Greater Utica Chamber of Commerce representing the region, we feel that the new Senate District 49, as drawn, would have a negative impact on the region and the people we serve. We represent over 500 businesses and organizations in the Utica-Rome area and have done so for 125 years. We are the largest regional Chamber and many of our members have businesses across city lines and with locations in both Utica and Rome, NY.

We are a member-based, business organization focused on the development of a prosperous economic climate that will enhance commercial growth and the quality of life for all who reside in region. Maintaining the communities of Utica and Rome within a single legislative district would ensure our elected leaders understand our issues and are focused on advocating for them at the state and federal level.

My community represents a diverse district, yet its residents share common interests. If the new 49th Senate district was to be split up into different districts, our representation would be diminished and would hinder the community's ability to come together. Many of our businesses, health and human services organizations, healthcare, and educational systems operate among the Utica-Rome region.
