

ORDER

Currently before the court are the following motions: (1) Plaintiffs' motion to impose remedial districts and in the alternative to reject Act 34 and begin remedial hearings; (2) Senator Robert Mellow's motion to stay; and (3) Defendants' motion to present evidence at the remedial hearing. Having considered the arguments, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- (1) Senator Mellow's motion to stay is **DENIED**;
- (2) Defendants' motion to present evidence at the remedial hearing is **GRANTED IN PART and DENIED IN PART**, as follows:
 - (A) Defendants will be allowed to present the following evidence at the hearing:
 - (i) An affidavit from Kathleen A. Sullivan, Executive Director of the Legislative Data Processing Center, including documentation of the population database upon which Act 34 was based;
 - (ii) Certified copies of the Armstrong County Court of Common Pleas docket in No. 2002-00081 and the documents reflected in the docket entries;

- (iii) Copies of the Legislative Journals for the Senate and House from April 15 and 17, 2002 which contain debate on Act 34; and
- (iv) Copies of the biography of Congressmen John Murtha, appearing on his official website, www.house.gov/murtha, on October 4, 2002.
- (B) Defendants will not be allowed to present the affidavit of James Scahill, Chairman of the Armstrong County Board of Commissioners.
- (3) The parties shall present oral argument regarding the constitutionality of Act 34 before the three-judge panel at **10:00 a.m. on Thursday**, **January 9, 2002**, in Courtroom No. 1, Ninth Floor, Federal Building, Third and Walnut Streets, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. The hearing shall conclude no later than 4:30 p.m. that day.
