COURT'S SCHEDULING ORDER

Following a hearing on March 9, 2022 with the parties in the above-captioned cases, the Court orders that the cases identified in the caption above are consolidated for all purposes.

In addition, the Court sets the following scheduling order. All dates are in 2022:

- March 9: Plaintiffs' expert disclosures and reports.
- March 11: Plaintiffs' declarations regarding standing.
- March 21: Plaintiffs' response to Defendants' motion to dismiss.
- March 25: Defendants' reply in support of their motion to dismiss.
Defendants' rebuttal expert disclosures and reports.
Close of fact discovery.
- March 28: In-person hearing on Defendants' motion to dismiss.
at 3:00 p.m.
- April 1: Pretrial briefs, witness lists, and exhibit lists.
- April 2: Marked exhibits e-filed.
- April 4-6: Trial.
- April 11: Final day of trial, if needed.

The parties shall file proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law five days after the last day of trial. The Court shall issue its opinion within 3-5 days of submission of findings of fact and conclusions of law.

To expedite the case, the Court enters this scheduling order over the objection of Defendants. Defendants are permitted to submit their written objections to the discovery on the record.
